LYM Camp COVID Precautions & Guidelines

Recommendations for campers/staff/prior to camp arrival:

10-day pre-camp increased vigilance to avoid COVID transmission.

Avoid high risk exposure places for 10-days prior to camp. (High crowd or close contact events) Vaccination is recommended for all staff/campers if possible.

Cleaning and Sanitizing procedures:

Prior to camper arrival:

Staff will clean and sanitize all buildings and areas that will be used during the week of camp. This includes all camper/staff cabins, mess hall, recreation hall, bathrooms, and craft areas.

All tables and chairs located throughout the camp will be cleaned and sanitized.

All equipment utilized at camp will be cleaned and sanitized including but not limited to, Kitchen equipment, dishes, utensils, play equipment, coolers, and craft supplies.

During the week of camp:

Camper cabins/villages will be required to be cleaned and sanitized. Camper cabins by campers in that cabin, bathroom, and showers by staff. Staff cabins will be cleaned and sanitized by staff utilizing that cabin.

Craft/Bible Study areas, kitchen, recreation hall will be sanitized after each use by staff.

Campers will sleep with six (6) foot of space between their head and the next person.

Camper Registration (Check-in)

A drive thru process ensuring that parents and non-campers never get out of their vehicles to minimize in camp cross person exposure.

Step 1 COVID precautions and Check-in. (main camp gate)

Verify camper is registered.

Everyone in car gets temperature check.

Quick covid questionnaire. (See COVID Screening Questionnaire) Any yes answer or high temp ;in the car and the whole family/car will be sent home. Verify Health Form

Step 2 Health Stop Medicine check-in. Health Form turn-in. **Step 3** Camper check-in. Assigned to village and cabin.

Step 4 Villages.

Luggage tags added to all campers' belongings (bags, fans, etc.) Nothing is removed from the vehicle without tag or label. Luggage will be added to the village truck or items will be carried by camper with the assistance of counselors to their village. Trailer will be taken to the village to be unloaded later.

Parent goodbye.

Masks:

A mask must be worn at all times by staff, volunteers, and campers.

Masks can be taken off for:

Meals

In assigned village only when outside or in own cabin.

Anytime outside when maintaining a CDC recommended distance from others.

In well ventilated buildings while still maintaining appropriate social distance.

Use of masks will be according to current CDC guidelines.

Temperature Checks:

Temperatures will be checked every morning before breakfast before entering the mess hall.

Those with high temps will automatically be isolated until a second temp can be taken.

Those with high temps after being rechecked will be sent home and asked to get a Covid test and inform us of the result as soon as possible.

Meals:

Every meal will be eaten with social distancing enforced.

Each person entering the mess hall will be given an antibacterial hand wipe to use and discard in a strategically placed trash can.

Other Alterations:

Chapel seating will be spaced out to allow appropriate social distancing.

Activities will take place outdoors whenever possible including recreation activities, Bible study sessions, meals when possible, and staff meetings.

Hand sanitizer, hand soap, will be available throughout camp for campers and staff to use regularly.

Campers will be asked to bring their own supply of masks to last them the week, but additional masks will be available.

This questionnaire was developed with criteria from the CDC. If your temperature is greater than 100.4 or you answer yes to any of the above questions: you and anyone else in your household or vehicle will not be admitted to camp. This is the result of an overabundance of precaution for the safety of all campers, staff, and volunteers.
